Barnhill said the Road Committee worked on a resolution to address a reoccurring issue facing new home builders with regard to getting a driveway permit. Dave Kruger researched other NE counties which also carry their liability insurance through NIRMA and found the county could model the MUTCD (Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices) table for intersection sight distance for speed.

WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RESOLUTION NO. 2025-6 ADOPTING UPDATED DRIVEWAY PERMIT SIGHT DISTANCE STANDARDS

WHEREAS Washington County requires that all new driveways accessing County Roads obtain an approved permit to ensure safe and appropriate access to the public roadway system; and

WHEREAS the County's current driveway permit requires a minimum of 500 feet of sight distance in both directions, measured from the proposed point of access; and

WHEREAS the Board recognizes that on roads with regulatory posted and enforced speed limits lower than the standard rural limit, reduced sight distance may still meet accepted engineering safety standards; and

WHEREAS the Board desires to clarify that adjustments to minimum sight distance may be allowed in such cases, but that posted speed limits will not be reduced to accommodate substandard driveway locations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Washington County Board of Supervisors that:

- 1. The minimum sight distance for driveway permits shall remain 500 feet, measured from the edge of the roadway at the proposed point of access, in both directions.
- 2. Where the roadway has a **regulatory posted and enforced speed limit lower than the standard rural limit**, reduced sight distance may be considered. **See table A**
- 3. **The County will not reduce speed limits** or issue exceptions to speed limit regulations to accommodate inadequate sight distance at proposed driveways.
- 4. Final determination on all driveway sight distance approvals shall be made by the County Road Superintendent or their designee, based on applicable safety and engineering standards.
